The author of Mad in America, **Robert Whitaker**, has won numerous awards as a journalist covering medicine and science. In the past few years, he has won the George Polk Award for Medical Writing and a National Association for Science Writers' Award for best magazine article (which appeared in *Fortune*). Mr. Whitaker also wrote "The case against antipsychotic drugs: a 50-year record of doing more harm than good," an excellent summary that appeared in the scientific journal *Medical Hypotheses* (Volume 62, Issue 1, January 2004).

In 1998, he co-wrote a series on psychiatric research for the *Boston Globe* which was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize for Public Service. Prior to writing *Mad in America*, he co-founded a publishing company, CenterWatch that covered the drug-development industry. He also previously worked as director of publications at Harvard Medical School, and was a features/medical writer at the *Albany Times Union* newspaper, in Albany, N.Y., for a number of years. Mr. Whitaker lives in Cambridge, Massachusetts. Currently, he is working on a new book which investigates the increase of juvenile bi-polar disorder.

Peter R. Breggin, M.D. began full time private practice of psychiatry in 1968. Since 1964 Dr. Breggin has been publishing peer-reviewed articles and medical books in his subspecialty of clinical psychopharmacology. He is the author of dozens of scientific articles and nineteen professional books.

In 1972 he founded The International Center for the Study of Psychiatry and Psychology (ICSP) as a nonprofit research and educational network. The Center is concerned with the impact of mental health theory and practices upon individual well-being, personal freedom, and family/community values. He also founded the peer-review journal, *Ethical Human Sciences and Services*. Dr. Breggin's background includes Harvard College, Case Western Reserve Medical School, a teaching fellowship at Harvard Medical School, a two-year staff appointment to the National Institute of Mental Health (NIMH), and a faculty appointment to the Johns Hopkins University Department of Counseling.
