Directions to Storer Auditorium

From North of Syracuse, Route 81

Take Rt. 81 south to exit 17 (Brighton Ave.).
Take first left onto State St.
Continue to second light, take right turn, followed by a quick left onto Salina St.
Continue to intersection of Rt. 173, take a right.
Continue on Rt. 173 1.8 miles to intersection of Rt. 175. Bear left onto Rt. 175.
Continue 0.8 miles to second traffic light. Turn right at College entrance.

From South of Syracuse, Route 81

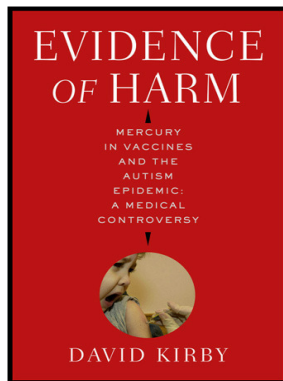
Take Rt. 81 north to exit 16 (Nedrow).
Turn left off exit on to Salina Street (Rt. 11) to Rt. 173.
Turn left on to Rt. 173 and continue 1.8 miles to intersection of Rt. 175. Bear left onto Rt. 175.
Continue on Rt. 175 0.8 miles to second traffic light. Turn right at College entrance.

From Downtown Syracuse

Take Salina St. south to Rt. 173 and turn right.
Continue on Rt. 173 1.8 miles to intersection of Rt. 175. Bear left onto Rt. 175.
Continue on Rt. 175 0.8 miles to second traffic light. Turn right at College entrance.

From New York State Thruway, East or West

Take Thruway exit #39 to Rt. 690 East.
Continue on Rt. 690 to Rt. 695.
Bear left on Rt. 695 to Fairmount/Rt. 5.
Turn right on Rt. 5 (West Genesee St.) and follow to third traffic light.
Turn left to Rt. 173 (Onondaga Rd.) and proceed 4 miles. Turn right at College entrance.

About David Kirby

David Kirby has been a professional journalist for over 15 years, and has written for The New York Times for the past eight years. Kirby was a contracted writer with the weekly City Section at The Times, where he covered many subjects including public health and local politics. Currently, Kirby has contributed to The Magazine, Arts & Leisure, Personal Health, Men's Health, Science Times, Escapes, Travel, Weekend, and other sections of the paper. Kirby has written for a number of national magazines, including Glamour, Redbook, Marie Claire, Mademoiselle, Self, Art News, and others.

In Evidence of Harm, Journalist David Kirby explores the chilling possibility that a vaccine additive may be fueling an apparent epidemic of autism, ADD, speech delay, and other disorders in America's children. Kirby explores both sides of this controversy, which has pitted families and their allies against the federal government, public health agencies, and powerful pharmaceutical giants. This disturbing, important book examines both the personal stories of families and the unfolding political drama in the courts and halls of congress.
